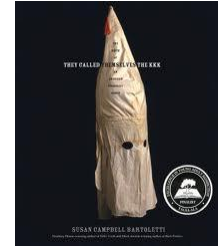
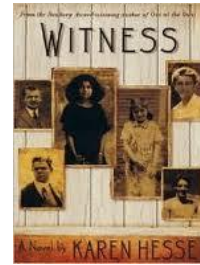

<p>Stewart, Gail B. <i>The Bermuda Triangle</i>, 2009. Provides an introduction to the accounts of mysterious happening in an area of the Atlantic Ocean known as the Bermuda Triangle.</p>	<p>Wynne-Jones, Tim. <i>Lord of the Fries and Other Stories</i>, 1999. A collection of short stories in which Canadian young people interact with the eccentric and vivid figures of their communities, schools, and families, including the Bermuda Triangle.</p>
<p>Whitby, Blay. <i>Artificial Intelligence</i>, 2001. What is AI? -- AI at work -- AI and biology -- Some challenges -- AI diffuses -- Present and future trends.</p>	<p>Hautman, Pete. <i>Rash</i>, 2006. In a future society that has decided it would "rather be safe than free," sixteen-year-old Bo's anger control problems land him in a tundra jail where he survives with the help of his running skills and an artificial intelligence program named Bork.</p>
<p>Aronson, Marc. <i>Witch-Hunt: Mysteries of the Salem Witch Trials</i>, 2003. Sifting through the facts, myths, and half-truths surrounding the 1692 witch trials in Salem, Massachusetts, a historian draws on primary sources to explore the events of that time.</p>	<p>Hemphill, Stephanie. <i>Wicked Girls: A Novel of the Salem Witch Trials</i>, 2010. When it is suggested that a spate of illnesses in the village are the result of witchcraft, three girls--Ann Putnam, servant Mercy Lewis and Ann's cousin Margaret Walcott--manifest symptoms with deadly ramifications.</p>
<p>Biegel, Gina M. <i>The Stress Reduction Workbook for Teens: Mindful Skills to Help You Deal with Stress</i>, 2009. Provides strategies and activities for teenagers to manage their stress, describing such tasks as identifying stressor events, concentrating on the present, letting go of negative self-judgements, self-care, and focusing on the positive.</p>	<p>Koja, Kathe. <i>Kissing the Bee</i>, 2007. The stress of finishing high school and preparing for college is compounded for Dana as she comes to realize that her best friend, Avra, is not the "queen bee" she has always seemed to be, and that Avra's boyfriend Emil might actually prefer a humbler "worker bee" like herself.</p>
<p>Hamilton, Jill. <i>Bullying and Hazing</i>, 2008. Describes what bullying and hazing is and what steps can be taken to stop it.</p> <p>Jacobs, Thomas A. <i>Teen Cyberbullying Investigated: Where Do Your Rights End and Consequences Begin?</i>, 2010. Presents a collection of landmark court cases involving cyberbullying, including sending threatening emails, writing hateful comments on blogs, and sending threatening messages using a false identity.</p>	<p>Griffin, Adele. <i>The Julian Game</i>, 2010. In an effort to improve her social status, a new scholarship student at an exclusive girls' school uses a fake online profile to help a popular girl get back at her ex-boyfriend, but the consequences are difficult to handle.</p> <p>Shulman, Mark. <i>Scrawl: A Novel</i>, 2010. Tod Munn is a bully. He's tough, but times are even tougher. The wimps have stopped coughing up their lunch money. The administration is cracking down. To make things worse, Tod and his friends get busted doing something bad. Something <i>really</i> bad.</p> <p>Apostilina, Michael. <i>Hazing Meri Sugarman</i>, 2006. Cindy's life is transformed when she arrives at college and is invited to join a sorority, but when Meri, one of its most popular sisters, becomes jealous of her bad things soon start happening for the new-and-improved Cindy.</p>

<p>Buscemi, Karen. <i>Split in Two: Keeping it Together When Your Parents Live Apart, 2009.</i> Provides advice to children of divorced parents on living in two homes simultaneously, including how to organize during moves, managing different lifestyles, and coping with the emotional stress of separation.</p>	<p>Vivian, Siobhan. <i>A Little Friendly Advice, 2008.</i> When Ruby's divorced father shows up unexpectedly on her sixteenth birthday, the week that follows is full of confusing surprises, including discovering that her best friend has been keeping secrets from her, her mother has not been truthful about the past, and life is often complicated.</p>
<p>Bartoletti, Susan Campbell. <i>They Called Themselves the KKK: The Birth of an American Terrorist, 2011.</i> Uses personal accounts unearthed from oral histories, congressional documents, and diaries, to unveil the creation of the Ku Klux Klan in Pulaski, Tennessee, and its spread across the American South.</p>	<p>Hesse, Karen. <i>Witness, 2001.</i> A series of poems express the views of various people in a small Vermont town, including a young black girl and a young Jewish girl, during the early 1920s when the Ku Klux Klan is trying to infiltrate the town.</p>
<p>Bowers, Rick. <i>Spies of Mississippi: The True Story of the Spy Network that Tried to Destroy the Civil Rights Movement, 2011.</i> True story of the spy network that tried to destroy the civil rights movement.</p>	<p>Armistead, John. <i>The Return of Gabriel, 2002.</i> In the summer of 1964, a thirteen-year-old white boy whose best friend is black is caught in the middle when civil rights workers and Ku Klux Klan members clash in a small town near Tupelo, Mississippi.</p> <p>Magoon, Kekla. <i>The Rock and the River, 2009.</i> In 1968 Chicago, fourteen-year-old Sam Childs is caught in a conflict between his father's nonviolent approach to seeking civil rights for African Americans and his older brother, who has joined the Black Panther Party.</p>
<p>Bausum, Ann. <i>Denied, Detained, Deported: Stories from the Dark Side of American Immigration, 2010.</i> Examines the history of American immigration, particularly those lesser-known stories of immigrants who were denied entrance into the United States or detained for security reasons, including the story of a ship of Jewish refugees.</p>	<p>Restrepo, Bettina. <i>Illegal, 2011.</i> Nora, a fifteen-year-old Mexican girl, faces the challenges of being an illegal immigrant in Texas when she and her mother cross the border in search of Nora's father.</p>
<p>Valentino, Serena. <i>How to Be a Zombie, 2010.</i> A whimsical reference for the newly undead counsels apprentice zombies on everything from zombie personality types and passing for a human to pairing the correct music with brain eating and the truth about celebrity zombies.</p>	<p>Ryan, Carrie. <i>The Forest of Hands and Teeth, 2009.</i> Through twists and turns of fate, orphaned Mary seeks knowledge of life, love, and especially what lies beyond her walled village and the surrounding forest, where dwell the unconsecrated, aggressive flesh-eating people who were once dead.</p>
<p>Dau, John Bul. <i>Lost Boy, Lost Girl: Escaping Civil War in the Sudan, 2011.</i> Chronicles the experiences of a husband and wife who as children fled the poverty and violence of southern Sudan, describing the devastating impact of famine and war on the region while sharing lighthearted memories of their efforts to adapt to American life.</p>	<p>Cooney, Caroline B. <i>Diamonds in the Shadows, 2007.</i> The Finches, a Connecticut family, sponsor an African refugee family of four, all of whom have been scarred by the horrors of civil war, and who inadvertently put their benefactors in harm's way.</p> <p>Manivong, Laura. <i>Escaping the Tiger, 2010.</i> In 1982 twelve-year-old Vonlai, his parents, and sister Dalah, escape from Laos to a Thai refugee camp where they spend four long years struggling to survive in hopes of one day reaching America.</p>
<p>Anonymous. <i>Quicksand: HIV/AIDS in Our Lives, 2009.</i> A first-person narrative discusses how the author's brother-in-law was diagnosed with AIDS and his battle with the disease, explaining how HIV is transmitted and describing the emotions people feel when a loved one has the virus.</p>	<p>Sheinmel, Courtney. <i>Positively, 2009.</i> Thirteen-year-old Emmy, grieving over her mother who died of AIDS, resentful of having to live with her father and pregnant stepmother, and despairing about her future, finds hope at a summer camp for HIV-positive girls like herself. Includes facts about Elizabeth Glaser, one of the founders of the Pediatric AIDS Foundation.</p>

<p>Conrad, Lauren. <i>Lauren Conrad Style, 2010.</i> Provides advice on hair, beauty, and fashion in a guide filled with photographs of the author in fun and flirty outfits and tips on her favorite looks.</p>	<p>Walsh, Chloe. <i>Fashionistas, 2008.</i> Four very different teenagers land summer internships at Couture magazine in New York City, where they learn about and compete with each other in the dog-eat-dog fashion world.</p>
<p>Nardo, Don. <i>Cloning, 2002.</i> Discusses cloning as it relates to animals, plants, and humans, and analyzes the story behind the creation of Dolly, benefits and disadvantages of the science, and moral issues surrounding the cloning of humans.</p>	<p>Cave, Patrick. <i>Sharp North, 2006.</i> In a futuristic world, Great Families rule Britain through a caste system where reproduction is seriously restricted, while the families keep illegal clones or "spares" of themselves.</p> <p>McKissack, Patricia. <i>The Clone Codes, 2010.</i> On the run from a bounty hunter who arrested her mother for being part of a secret society devoted to freeing clones, thirteen-year-old Leanna is forced to consider the value of freedom and what it really means to be human in 2170 America.</p>
<p>Editors of Popular Mechanics Magazine. <i>The Boy Magician: 156 Amazing Tricks & Sleights of Hand, 2008.</i> A collection of entertaining vintage tricks and projects, all originally published in Popular Mechanics during the first two decades of the twentieth century, offers instruction in nearly 160 ingenious magic tricks, including sleight-of-hand, disappearing coins, optical illusions, and more, all complemented by nostalgic illustrations.</p>	<p>Ruiz Zafón, Carlos. <i>The Prince of Mist, 2010.</i> In 1943, in a seaside town where their family has gone to be safe from war, thirteen-year-old Max Carver and his sister, fifteen-year-old Alicia, with their new friend Roland, face off against an evil magician who is striving to complete a bargain made before he died.</p>
<p>Freedman, Russell. <i>The War to End All Wars: World War I, 2010.</i> An introduction to World War I explains its relevance as a conflict that involved many nations and casualties while introducing modern weaponry and military strategies that have shaped all subsequent wars.</p>	<p>Hamley, Dennis. <i>Without Warning: Ellen's Story 1914-1918, 2006.</i> When World War I calls her brother to the front lines, Ellen Wilkins decides to leave the safety of home and pursue her calling as a nurse, in this powerful novel that portrays the realities of war and its lifelong effects.</p> <p>Spillebeen, Geert. <i>Kipling's Choice, 2002.</i> In 1915, mortally wounded in Loos, France, eighteen-year-old John Kipling, son of writer Rudyard Kipling, remembers his boyhood and the events leading to what is to be his first and last World War I battle.</p>
<p>Jarrow, Gail. <i>Lincoln's Flying Spies: Thaddeus Lowe and the Civil War Balloon Corps, 2010.</i> Describes the contributions made to the Union's efforts in the Civil War by Thaddeus Lowe and a corps of hot air balloonists who helped spy on the Confederate army, despite becoming targets in the war themselves.</p>	<p>Janeczko, Paul B. <i>The Dark Game: True Spy Stories, 2010.</i> A collection of true spy stories from throughout the history of the United States, discussing personalities, missions, traitors, technological advances, and more.</p>
<p>Guiberson, Brenda Z. <i>Disasters: Natural and Man-Made Catastrophes Through the Centuries, 2010.</i> A history of 10 well-known disasters--from the great Chicago fire to Hurricane Katrina--explores the causes and effects of the devastation as well as with the power of humankind to persevere in the face of adversity.</p>	<p>Richards, Jame. <i>Three Rivers Rising: A Novel of the Johnstown Flood, 2010.</i> Spending the summers at an elite 19th-century resort by the shimmering Allegheny Mountain reservoir, 16-year-old Celestia pursues a secret romance with a working-class boy and is horrified when heavy rains trigger a tragic dam failure in her boyfriend's valley community.</p> <p>Trueman, Terry. <i>Hurricane, 2008.</i> A fictional account of one of the worst storms to hit the Caribbean--Hurricane Mitch in 1998--told from the perspective of a thirteen-year-old boy living in a small village in Honduras.</p>
